Dental Clinic Manager

General Statement of Duties: Is responsible for providing leadership and management of clinical operations at the Dental clinics. Acts as first-line supervisor for Dental Assistants. Works collaboratively with clinic medical staff and with system wide leadership team as needed.

Supervision Received: Reports to Health Center Director.

Supervision Exercised: Supervises specified Dental Assistants and paraprofessional staff as directed.

Essential functions:

- 1. Coordinates and oversees the operations of the dental clinic within the Community Health Center:
 - Assists in creating dental program standards and goals.
 - Assists in creating and updating dental policies, procedures, and workflows.
 - Coordinates patient registration and work flow with the front office.
 - Integrates work with other staff to ensure timely and accurate patient flow, including coordination with dental billing and collections staff.
 - Accurately and consistently understands and communicates (written and oral) dental terminology while relaying information to co-workers, patients, and outside entities.
 - Oversees referrals in-house and to outside dental / medical offices.
 - Provides continuous support with dental software.
- 2. Participates in the ongoing continuous quality and performance improvement process.
 - Collecting and analyzing data to determine the needs of the target population.
 - Using data to implement and initiate program development
 - Develop reports and provide data on outcomes of individual client interventions as well as general program effectiveness.
 - Provide assistance, training, and sustainment of non-clinical aspects of all initiatives as designated by the PIQA committee.
 - Work closely with the Patient Accounts Manager to ensure standardization of processes between all locations. •
 - Act as the scheduling and front office Superuser for eClinicalWorks and peripherals for both locations.
 - Attend and participate in Superuser, PIQA, CHC staff and other meetings as appropriate. •
 - Assist in creating workflows, procedures, forms, and policies.

Education: Associate's Degree or higher in business, dental and / or other Health Care related field.

Experience: Medical/dental billing and coding, staff management, dental clinic/dental experience preferred

Requirements:

- 2. If car is used, must provide proof of adequate insurance coverage totaling at least \$300,000 and valid Colorado driver's license.
- 3. Current CPR certification according to agency policy.
- 4. Proven Competency in the Performance of Point of Care tests.

Skills:

- 1. Psychomotor skills to provide nursing care, including daily and repetitive pinching, grasping, and manipulating (i.e. wound care, flushing I.V. lines).
- 2. Daily standing, squatting, walking, bending, and maneuvering in private homes which are not barrier-free.
- 3. Heavy lifting (>50 pounds) to transfer or turn an adult, with or without assistive devices; and lifting requirement of 25 pounds (to pick up nursing bag from floor and place shoulder strap on shoulder), approximately twice per patient.

Knowledge:

- 1. Thorough knowledge of nursing theory and practice.
- 2. Knowledge of evaluation techniques utilized in the establishment of a specialized regimen of nursing care.

Abilities:

- 1. Can read and interpret physicians' orders and notes from other caregivers, as well as respond to them, verbally and in writing.
- 2. Has ability to calculate drug dosages, mix insulin, measure intake/output, program I.V. pump, etc.
- 3. Ability to serve as a role model in orienting and working with inexperienced nurses or other staff members.
- 4. Ability to communicate effectively, verbally and in writing.
- 5. Ability to motivate and train employees.
- 6. Ability to establish and maintain working relationships with professional and paraprofessional medical personnel; patients: relatives and friends of patients; and the general public.

Equipment:

- 1. Equipment to be utilized may include wheelchairs, ventilators, pulse oximetry units, oxygen tanks, etc. Daily, per-patient use of oral thermometer, sphygmomanometer, syringes, etc. and making home visits in all weather conditions.
- 2. Daily use of telephone, computer, copier and other office equipment.

Working Conditions:

1. Work environment is highly variable, as care is performed in clinics, non-medical facilities, public buildings and private homes. Lighting, acoustics, air quality, temperature, and environmental hazards are not predictable.
