At The Haven, we tailor our care and interactions with each resident to their unique personality and needs. Our residents are family and our facility is home. This quick story from our Director is just one of many examples of this.

Grace Kallay came to us last year from a large assisted living facility in Denver. Due to some dementia, she was labeled a "wanderer" and confined to her room unless accompanied by staff or a family member. Grace's daughter thinks her mother was simply overwhelmed and confused by the large facility. Being kept in her room was affecting Grace's mood, outlook and ability to engage with others.

Grace's daughter and her husband purchased a home near Yampa, and she moved her mom into The Haven. Here, Grace is free to move throughout the facility (residents are always supervised) and is able to go back and forth to her room unassisted. Grace's daughter tells me often how grateful she is for the warmth and compassion of our staff and the overall improvement to her mother's quality of life since she arrived at The Haven.
