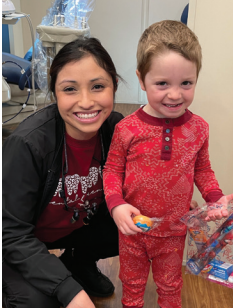

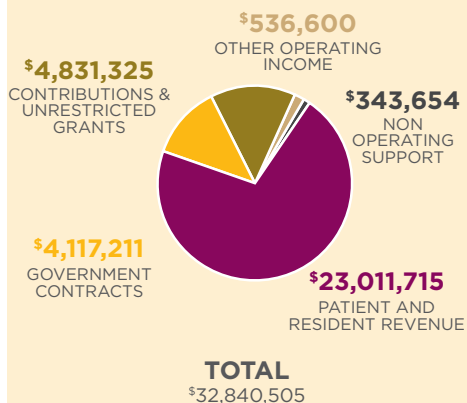

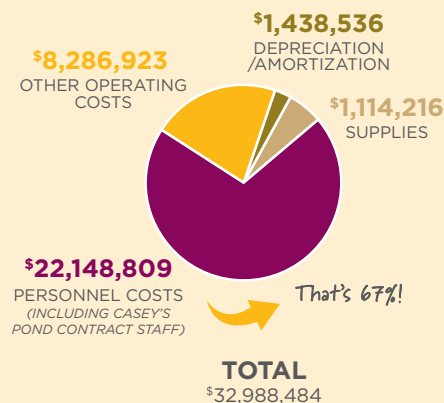
FINANCIAL SUMMARY
